
This site is linked to Google Maps, so you can explore from wherever you are – great for unfamiliar destinations!

Father of folklore route:

places connected to Kunio Yanagita

[Start & Goal: Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center]



Travel around the places where Kunio Yanagita, the father of Japanese folklore studies, spent his childhood and experience the scenery he saw for yourself. You may even catch a glimpse of the world of folklore. Make the most of the charms of Fukusaki Town with this route. There's a Memorial Museum, a shrine for scholarly success, the area's specialty product mochimugi (barley), and even yokai.

Approx. 2 hours

Overlaying stamp rally route

[Start: Gajiro tube/Goal: Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center]



Enjoy the first manhole-themed overlaying stamp rally in western Japan. Enjoy the anticipation—what will the picture look like when you're done? Encounter the Gajiro tube and nine yokai benches on this affordable and fun route.

Nagusayama trekking route

[Start & Goal: Youth Outdoor Activity Center]



Try walking around Mt. Nagusayama, Fukusaki Town's highest peak standing 683 m tall, to experience the beauty of its natural world. The Odaki Falls (known as the Nagusa Waterfalls) were chosen as one of the Eight Views of the prefecture, and visitors can enjoy elegant scenery in all four seasons.

Easy yokai bench route

[Start & Goal: Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center]



We recommend this route for people who want to enjoy the perspective of the yokai world as they stroll around Fukusaki Town. If you get tired, you can rest in the Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center or Mochimugi no Yakata food center!

Approx. 1.5 hours

Shrine and temple tour route

[Start: Ekimae Tourism and Exchange Center/Goal: Monju-so Hotel]

Why not refresh your mind and body by traveling leisurely around historic shrines and temples? Try taking a breather in Mochimugi no Yakata food center or Monju-so Hotel and spending some moments of serenity in traditional temples and shrines.

Yokai bench route for parents and children

[Start & Goal: Tsujikawa Tourism and Exchange Center]



The town is home to many charming yokai that will make you giggle—have fun taking pictures of your children with them! A number of yokai goods are also available, so make sure you check them out.

Tumulus (kofun) route

[Start & Goal: Ekimae Tourism and Exchange Center]



Myotokusan Tumulus



Keep history in mind as you try to find your favorite tumulus (kofun). Take this route to view precious cultural properties, including the Myotokusan Tumulus, a cultural property designated by the prefecture, and Jinshaku Temple, a cultural property designated by the town.

[Start: Tsujikawayama Park /Goal: Former Oguni Residence]
